	<p>St. Matthias Church, window in the west (Claremont) wall of the chancel, near the main altar</p>	<p>Rays of light stream down from heaven onto Mary, Jesus' mother. Mary became pregnant with Jesus through the grace of the Holy Spirit, often shown as rays of light coming to her.</p> <p>Because this window also depicts the Assumption of Mary into heaven, the rays of light and grace also guide her to eternal life.</p>
	<p>Queen of Angels Church, window in the west (alley) wall of the church, above the window showing the marriage of Mary and Joseph.</p>	<p>This angel is holding a <i>pharos</i>, an ancient lighthouse. Like a more modern lighthouse, it warns sailors about rocks and other hazards, and helps them to know where they are.</p>
	<p>Queen of Angels Church, during the Easter vigil, at the ambo (pulpit) from which the readings from Scripture are proclaimed. The candle remains there during the Easter season.</p> <p>At other times of the year, the candle can be found on the west side of the church in the area where baptisms are celebrated.</p>	<p>As the new Easter candle is blessed and brought forward at the Easter vigil, we sing "Christ Our Light, thanks be to God!" This candle and the candles lit from it are the only lights in the darkened church for the first part of the Easter Vigil service.</p>
