

	<p>Queen of Angels Church, on the wall of the church near where baptisms are celebrated.</p>	<p>When we are Baptized and each time we make the Sign of the Cross, we are praying in the three-part name of God, the Holy Trinity. We respect the name of Jesus Christ, and we should use it for prayer and not speak it in anger or for cursing. In Baptism, we become part of the family of faith and take on the role of a disciple of Jesus and are called a Christian, a member of Christ’s Church.</p>
	<p>Queen of Angels Church, on the Communion Rail, which forms the front edge of the sanctuary, the raised area near the altar.</p>	<p>This is the Chi-Rho, also known as the monogram of Christ. A monogram is putting the initials of your name or your logo on something personal, like on a towel or a set of dishes. In Greek, the language of the New Testament, the first two letters of Christ are X (chi) and P (rho). Here the Chi-Rho also has a circle around it, which means eternity.</p>
	<p>St. Matthias Church, above the chalice on the door of the tabernacle, built into the old high altar which stands behind the main altar.</p>	<p>JHS (often written IHS or IHC) is a monogram of Jesus, for the first three letters of the name in Greek, which using the Greek alphabet is written ΙΗΣΟΥΣ in all capital letters or Ιησούς with lower case letters. The rays of glory show the holiness of the name and of the consecrated host on which it is written, which has become the true presence of Jesus Christ.</p>
