

	<p>Queen of Angels Church, part of a window in the Apostles Adoration Chapel, the room behind the statue of Mary. The window has text and symbols from the Apostle's Creed.</p>	<p>The fishing net alludes to several apostles who were fishermen in their careers before Jesus invited them to come follow him and learn to be "fishers of men." Here the meaning is about the communion of saints, the idea that the Church is made up not just of people here on earth but also the saints in heaven.</p>
	<p>Queen of Angels Church, on both the front and back of the wooden altar used for Mass.</p>	<p>The ship is a symbol of the Church. The main part of the church, where the people sit, is even called the nave, from the Latin word for ship (same root as navy and naval). People on a ship are all traveling to the same destination together, and have to trust in their captain and crew to get them there safely.</p>
	<p>Queen of Angels Church, high up on the wooden structure behind the altar, near where the priest sits.</p>	<p>The anchor cross and fish are ancient symbols for Jesus. Anchors suggest being steady and firm in the faith, like a ship anchored in the harbor. In times of persecution Christians used the fish as a secret sign to identify one another. Here the fish and anchor are surrounded by fruitful vines, suggesting Jesus as the fruitful vine ("I am the vine and you are the branches").</p>
