SOCIETY OF ST VINCENT DEPAUL

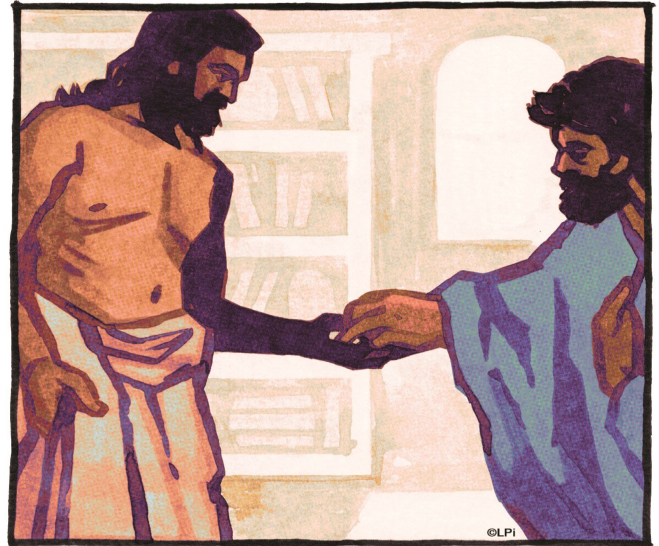
In the Gospel today, Jesus stands in the midst of us and says: "Peace be with you!"

GOSPEL MEDITATION

A protestant pastor friend of mine was invited to meet Pope Francis with a group of other pastors. He noticed the Pope's chair was especially ornate and set at the head of the group. He somewhat playfully said, "Holy Father, why do *you* get that special chair?" The group chuckled nervously at my friend's audacious chide. The following year, the group was invited to return. They entered the room to find only simple chairs placed in a circle. Pope Francis entered, sat down in one of the humble chairs and, looking directly at my friend, with a twinkle in his eye, asked, "What do you think of my chair now?" My friend was stunned that the Pope remembered his concerns — and took the time to answer them. Thomas the apostle was certainly stunned by the Risen Jesus displaying his wounds in person. But he also must have been equally shocked that Jesus knew and answered his particular questions, worries, and even demands related to his faith. How humbled — and perhaps a bit terrified — he must have been to realize God remembers his concerns and cares enough to answer them. What questions or demands about Jesus do you find in your heart? Like Thomas, will you be bold enough to voice them this week? How wonderful to know that if we do so, God will remember and respond even to our most audacious desires.

WRITTEN IN THE WOUNDS

For all the condemnation Thomas the Doubter has received in 2000 years of homilies, I think there's something to admire in him. Thomas is not unique. We all waver at some point, overcome by hesitation, distracted by the clamor of the world which seeks at every turn to shout above the whisper of the divine. Thomas knows what he saw on Good Friday: his friend nailed to a cross, a sword driven through his body. He saw the blood and the water. He saw these things with his own eyes, eyes given to him by God, eyes which have never failed him before. And God doesn't ask us to suspend reality to believe in Him. He only asks us to be discerning about how that reality is interpreted in our hearts. Thomas knows the man before him is either a fraud, preying on the hopes and anxieties of the traumatized disciples, or he is the Christ, the Savior of the world, accomplisher of impossible things. But where to look, to tell the difference? Satan once appeared to the great mystic saint, Teresa of Avila, disguised as Jesus. She knew instantly that he was a fraud. Enraged, he demanded to know where his deception had failed. "You have no wounds," she told him simply. Could we have accepted a savior who did not bleed? I don't think we could, because sooner or later, we would all stand before him and say, "Here is where the world hurt me. Here, and here, and here. What about you?" Christ can point to his hands, his feet, his side. "Here, and here, and here," he can say. "And I overcame them all." It's the wounds, you see. The truth is in the wounds.

Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

¿Sabías qué? el segundo domingo del Tiempo Pascual fue designado “Domingo de la Divina Misericordia” por el Papa Juan Pablo II, en el año 2,000 durante la canonización de santa Faustina Kowalska. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, en su número 1225, ilumina y catequiza lo que el Papa y santa Faustina nos transmitieron al experimentar la misericordia divina en sus vidas. *“En su Pascua, Cristo abrió a todos los hombres las fuentes del Bautismo. En efecto, había hablado ya de su pasión que iba a sufrir en Jerusalén como de un Bautismo con que debía ser bautizado. La sangre y el agua que brotaron del costado traspasado de Jesús crucificado son figuras del Bautismo y de la Eucaristía, sacramentos de la vida nueva: desde entonces, es posible nacer del agua y del Espíritu para entrar en el Reino de Dios”*. Santa Faustina al pintar el retrato del Señor de la Misericordia nos muestra esta imagen de la misericordia de Cristo Crucificado dada a nosotros por el Bautismo y la Eucaristía. El Papa Francisco, también, nos lo explica de la siguiente manera: *“La misericordia a la luz de la Pascua se deja percibir como una verdadera forma de conocimiento. Se conoce a través de los sentidos, se conoce a través de la intuición, a través de la razón y aún de otras formas. Bien, se puede conocer también a través de la experiencia de la misericordia, porque la misericordia abre la puerta de la mente para comprender mejor el misterio de Dios y de nuestra experiencia personal (16 de abril del 2023).*

ESCRITO EN LAS HERIDAS

A pesar de toda la condena que Tomás el Incrédulo ha recibido en 2000 años de homilias, creo que hay algo que admirar en él. Tomás no es el único. Todos vacilamos en algún momento, vencidos por la indecisión, distraídos por el clamor del mundo que busca a cada paso gritar por encima del susurro de lo divino. Tomás sabe lo que vio el Viernes Santo: a su amigo clavado en una cruz y una espada atravesándole el cuerpo. Vio la sangre y el agua. Vio estas cosas con sus propios ojos, ojos que Dios le dio, ojos que nunca antes le habían fallado. Y Dios no nos pide que suspendamos la realidad para creer en Él. Sólo nos pide que seamos discernidores sobre cómo se interpreta esa realidad en nuestro corazón. Tomás sabe que el hombre que tiene ante él es o un fraude, que se aprovecha de las esperanzas y ansiedades de los discípulos traumatizados, o es el Cristo, el Salvador del mundo, realizador de cosas imposibles. ¿Pero dónde mirar para notar la diferencia? Satanás se apareció una vez a la gran mística, santa Teresa de Ávila, disfrazado de Jesús. Ella supo al instante que él era un fraude. Enfurecido, exigió saber en qué había fallado su engaño. “No tienes heridas,” le dijo simplemente. ¿Podríamos haber aceptado un salvador que no sangrara? No creo que pudiéramos, porque tarde o temprano todos nos presentaríamos ante él y diríamos: “Aquí es donde el mundo me lastimó. Aquí, aquí y aquí. ¿Y a ti?” Cristo puede señalar sus manos, sus pies, su costado. “Aquí, y aquí, y aquí,” puede decir. “Y los superé a todos.” Son las heridas, como puedes ver. La verdad está en las heridas. *Tomás respondió y le dijo: “¡Señor mío y Dios mío!” — Juan 20:28*

Harriet (2019) From her escape from slavery through the dangerous missions she led to liberate hundreds of slaves through the Underground Railroad, the story of heroic abolitionist Harriet Tubman is told. Directed by Kasi Lemmons, starring Cynthia Erivo, Joe Alwyn, and Leslie Odom, Jr.

St. Andrew of Crete (650-c.726) also known as St. Andrew of Jerusalem, was born in the Syrian city of Damascus to devout Christian parents. According to legend, he was mute until he was 7 years old and miraculously cured after he received his First Holy Communion. As a young teenager, Andrew entered a monastery near Jerusalem. His exceptional qualities quickly caught the attention of his superiors, leading to his appointment as Archdeacon by Theodore, the Patriarch of Jerusalem at the time. The Patriarch of Jerusalem is the head bishop of the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Jerusalem. Theodore also sent Andrew to represent the Church at the Sixth Ecumenical Council in Constantinople called by Emperor Constantine, playing a role in addressing the heresy of Monothelism. This Sixth Council was pivotal in establishing that Jesus had both divine and human nature. St. Andrew of Crete would go on to become an influential theologian, bishop, and hymnographer. Around the year 700 he was appointed Archbishop of the city of Gortyn, on the island of Crete. His service to the Church included charitable work for the poor and orphaned and he is credited with introducing the canon, a new form of hymn, into the liturgy. His most renowned work, the Great Canon, is a masterpiece that guides the faithful through repentance and a return to God. To this day, the Great Canon is chanted twice a year in Eastern Orthodox liturgies during Lent. It takes around three hours to complete and includes more than 200 full-body prostrations along with its many odes, litanies, and refrains. While the exact date of Andrew's death remains uncertain, it is known that he passed away on the island of Mytilene while returning to Crete from Constantinople. St. Andrew of Crete, pray for us!
