Dear family of faith,

Just quick word of thanks, again, to all those who made Holy Week and Easter such a beautiful celebration. It was an honor and joy to experience Holy Week here at Queen of Apostles and I am glad so many came out to pray and celebrate Jesus' life, death and Resurrection, or Paschal mystery, as it is called.

As I have mentioned before, we are so grateful to Mr. Bill Brennan for his decades of service to the Archdiocese and a dozen or more years of service here at our Parish. He will be finishing up here mid-May and moving into much deserved retirement and family time. Thank you, Bill, for your excellent care for our campuses! We are so grateful! I look forward to announcing the new Director of Operations in a few weeks.

Also, profound gratitude to Rana Brizgys for her service as principal of Queen of Angels School. It has been an honor to get to know her and her competent care for Queen of Angels School. Thank you! I am so sad to see you go. I will be able to announce the new Principal in a few weeks as well.

A few other changes are directly linked to belt tightening measures. As you heard about last year, we were significantly short on our revenue side, which meant dipping into savings last year. We will probably have to do that again this year. To help keep that dip into savings as minimal as possible. We have had to cut back in many areas.

1. Unfortunately, we have had to reduced our trusty maintenance man Mr. Johnny Stroka to part time. We are so grateful for the way he cares for our school! Thank you Johnny!

2. Also, unfortunately, Kathleen McCarthy who served as Development Director in our School and then more recently in our Parish, is stepping back from her roll and will not be replaced this year. Thank you Kathleen!

3. Also unfortunately, we have had to cut the role of assistant to Religious Education and we are so grateful to Monica Hohner for supporting her daughter Rachel in that capacity. That role, too, will not be replaced. Thank you Monica!

4. And finally, we have had to draw back from paying four section leaders at the 9:00 and 11:00 Masses, to four section leaders at only the 11:00 Mass. In addition to hiring a Music Director, organist and cantor for every Mass, the four section leaders at both Masses is unsustainable and unbalanced with our investment at other Masses. As we move from a Music program to a Music ministry, your support, desire to join our Parish choir, and involvement is more necessary than ever! Thanks especially to Cantor Lauren who is no longer with us.

Algunos otros cambios están directamente relacionados con las medidas de ajuste del cinturón. Como escucharon el año pasado, estábamos significativamente cortos en nuestro lado de ingresos, lo que significó caer en ahorros el año pasado. Probablemente tendremos que hacerlo de nuevo este año. Para ayudar a mantener esa caída en los ahorros lo más mínimo posible. Hemos tenido que reducir en muchas áreas.

1. Desafortunadamente, hemos tenido que reducir a nuestro fiel hombre de mantenimiento, el Sr. Johnny Stroka, a tiempo parcial. ¡Estamos muy agradecidos por la forma en que se preocupa por nuestra escuela! ¡Gracias Johnny!

2. También, desafortunadamente, Kathleen McCarthy, quien se desempeñó como Directora de Desarrollo en nuestra Escuela y luego más recientemente en nuestra Parroquia, se retira de su rol y no será reemplazada este año. ¡Gracias Kathleen!

3. También, desafortunadamente, hemos tenido que recortar el papel de asistente de Educación Religiosa y estamos muy agradecidos a Monica Hohner por apoyar a su hija Rachel en esa capacidad. Ese papel tampoco será reemplazado. ¡Gracias Mónica!

4. Y finalmente, hemos tenido que retractarnos de pagar a cuatro líderes de sección en las Misas de las 9:00 y 11:00, a cuatro líderes de sección solo en la Misa de las 11:00. Además de contratar a un Director Musical, un organista y un cantor para cada Misa, los cuatro líderes de sección en ambas Misas son insostenibles y desequilibrados con nuestra inversión en otras Misas. A medida que pasamos de un programa de música a un ministerio de música, su apoyo, deseo de unirse a nuestro coro parroquial y participación es más necesario que nunca. Gracias especialmente a Cantor Lauren que ya no está con nosotros.

These are all hard cuts, and perhaps not the end of the cuts. Our spending is similar to pre-pandemic times, but our revenue is nowhere near pre-pandemic times. PPP got us through two fiscal years ago, but last year and this year, we are drawing on savings, which is unsustainable. I look forward to sharing our budget for next year in May. Also, I am happy to share that by the time you read this the St. Matthias Rectory should be sold to a legacy St. Matthias family who will create apartments in the Rectory and not build the contested town homes. I think this is a win win for everyone. The sale price was just over \$1.5 million. I look forward to sharing a summary of all real-estate sales from our St. Matthias Campus and the remaining Capital debt repayment that is necessary to be repaid, as well as, operating debt that would be repaid if bequests or more real estate sales happen. Stay tuned for detailed reporting on this.

More than anything, know that I am an open book when it comes to finances. I share everything I know about finances! Please ask. It is the least I can do for you who are so generous to your Parish. Thank you so much! If you find that your giving is not where you would like it to be, please use this opportunity to make the change. Profound gratitude!

GOSPEL MEDITATION

When I was a kid, a friend at my home parish told me, “If you get to Mass by the Gospel reading, it counts!” As a lifelong late-arriver, it’s something I have told myself many times, especially in my earlier years as a Catholic. If the “it counts” is justifiable on a pathetically minimal scale of liturgical legalism, then the Gospel reading today shows how insanely wrong-headed it is, and how helpful it is to re-think the Mass in its light.

The famous “Road to Emmaus” story recounts, on that first Sunday of the Resurrection, the basic two-fold structure of the Mass: *Word*, followed by *Eucharist*. Jesus spends a significant period of time with two dismayed disciples, as he connects a wide swath of the Hebrew scriptures with his own suffering, death, and resurrection. They would later report that this Liturgy of the Word touched their hearts with an inexplicable fire. This Word-induced flame alone is what leads the two disciples to discover Jesus’ presence in the “breaking of the bread.” With this in mind, how can we possibly think that the Liturgy of the Word is unnecessary or incidental? The two disciples needed the Scriptures explained to them in order to experience Jesus alive in the eucharistic breaking of bread. Sure, we say, but they had the Risen Jesus. But that’s precisely the point: Jesus is risen and accompanies us in both parts of the Mass. Imagine how much our experience of Jesus in the Eucharist would deepen if we (preachers and listeners) took even more seriously that Jesus himself sets our hearts ablaze with his Word *so that* we know him in the Eucharist. That Word-induced fire counts, too!

Biography

St. Paul the Apostle (c.4-c.64) was named Saul of Tarsus before his conversion. He was born to a devout Jewish family who followed strict Pharisaic traditions for generations. He spoke Greek and was formally educated in Jewish culture, scripture, and traditions. As an adult he worked as a tentmaker as well as an enforcer for the Jewish leadership in their efforts against new Christian converts. He is known to have taken an active part in the stoning of St. Stephen, the first martyr, and considered himself to be a shining example of Judaism. Saul’s conversation to Christianity took place while he was traveling to Damascus to persecute Christians there. According to Scripture, “a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, ‘Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?’” (Acts 9:3-4). Stricken blind by the vision, Saul continued to Damascus where he was healed and immediately began meeting with other disciples in the area and preaching that Jesus is Lord. He changed his name to the Roman version of Saul, Paul, after his conversation because it was more common among the Gentiles. For years he traveled all over the region starting churches and preaching the Gospel to the Gentiles. Paul’s letters to the communities he served make up thirteen of the books of the New Testament today. His writings encourage new believers to learn about Jesus through Scripture and prayer, partaking in the Eucharist, and serving those in need. He was eventually beheaded as part of systematic executions of Christian leaders in Rome. St. Paul is known as the Apostle to the Gentiles, and the most prolific Christian missionary of all time. St. Paul, pray for us!
